

# PIANO PRACTICE BOOK – SETUP INSTRUCTIONS

## WHAT YOU NEED:

bright coloured paper of at least 24lb weight

white printer paper

a printer which can print double-sided

- Print, double-sided, your choice of one of the Practice Book Covers, which have different icons on the front for variety. You can let students pick which symbol they want, or you can use a particular symbol (e.g. treble clef) for one year and then to freshen it up for the next year use bass clef. On the bottom inside cover will be a list where you can put their current exam working repertoire and date sessions. (It's printed near the page bottom so it won't detract the eyes when opening the cover, and won't accidentally bleed through the important part of the front cover if the paper is too thin or light.)
- Print 10-12 pages of the Music Practice Plan, double-sided. Twelve pages will last roughly a year (4 assignment blocks per page). Though some months will have 5 lessons, there may be some holidays or missed lessons so it should work out.
- Print double-sided, 1 or 2 pages of the staff paper. These will be placed at the back of the book.
- Print double-sided, the Piano (or Violin) Repertoire List with the Future Repertoire List. This will be the back cover. Put the Repertoire List on the outside (not the Future Repertoire). That way students can easily see their playable songs list without having to open the book. They can just flip the book over and play a song!
- Staple the cover, practice pages, staff paper, and back cover with three staples, and voila! You have a book!
